**ZHANG Qingmin** is a Professor and the Chair of the Department of Diplomacy, the School of International Studies, Peking University. His teaching and research interests include diplomatic studies and theory of foreign policy analysis with an empirical focus on China. He is the author of *Contemporary China's Diplomacy* (China International Press 2014, 2020) and *Foreign Policy Analysis* (Peking University Press 2019). He has translated from English to Chinese *Woodrow Wilson and Colonel House: A Personality Studies* (Central Compilation & Translation Press 2014), *Groupthink: Psychological Studies of Policy Decisions and Fiascos* (Central Compilation & Translation Press 2016) and *Diplomacy in a Globalizing World: Theories and Practice* (Shanghai People's Press 2020). He has also contributed many book chapters and articles to scholarly journals.

**D'HOOGHE Ingrid** is a Senior Research Associate at the Clingendael Institute, The Hague, and a researcher at the LeidenAsiaCentre, Leiden. She conducts research and lectures on China's foreign policy and diplomacy. Ingrid has worked as Policy Officer at the Netherlands Embassy in Beijing (1989-1991) and the Netherlands Embassy in Washington DC. (2005-2006). She graduated from Leiden University, the Netherlands, with a degree in Sinology, and studied Modern Chinese at Fudan University, Shanghai. She obtained a PhD in social sciences from the University of Antwerp on the topic of China's Public Diplomacy. She regularly publishes in national and international magazines and newspapers. From 2008-2014 she was co-editor of *Discussion Papers in Diplomacy*.

**POSTEMA Saskia** is a Junior Lecturer at the Institute of Security and Global Affairs, Leiden University, The Hague, and Blog & Media Editor for the *Hague Journal of Diplomacy*. Saskia has a Leiden MSc in International Relations and Diplomacy. Her research interests include non-state actor diplomacy, digital political communication and public diplomacy, citizen journalism, humanitarian intervention and intra-state conflict. She has previously worked for Dutch NGOs, and contributed to the *Huffington Post*.

**JIA Qingguo** is a Professor and the former Dean, at the School of International Studies, Peking University. He is a member of the Standing Committee and the Foreign Affairs Committee of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference; and the Director, Institute for Global Cooperation and Understanding; and Director, Global Governance, Peking University. He is also Vice President of the Chinese American Studies Association, China International Relations Studies Association and Chinese Japanese Studies Association. After receiving his PhD from Cornell University in 1988, he has taught at the University of Vermont, Cornell University, University of California at San Diego, University of Sydney in Australia, as well as at Peking University. He was a Research Fellow at the Brookings Institution between 1985 and 1986, 2001 and 2002, and a Visiting Professor at the University of Vienna in 1997. He has published extensively on US-China relations, relations between the Chinese mainland and Taiwan, Chinese foreign policy and Chinese politics.

**CHEN Wei** is a doctoral candidate in the Department of International Relations at the School of Social Sciences, Tsinghua University, in Beijing. She is also a Research Fellow at the Centre for Development and Cooperation in Northeast Asia, Dalian University of Technology, in Dalian, China.

**WISEMAN Geoffrey** is the endowed chair of Applied Diplomacy at DePaul University. He was a former Professor and Director at the Asia-Pacific College of Diplomacy at the Australian National University (ANU). He came to ANU from the University of Southern California. He has also worked in the Strategic Planning Unit of the Executive Office of the United Nations Secretary-General; and as peace and security program officer at the Ford Foundation in New York City. Professor Wiseman is a former Australian foreign service officer, serving in three diplomatic postings (Stockholm, Hanoi, and Brussels) and as private secretary to the Australian Foreign Minister, Gareth Evans. He has also authored, edited or co-edited five books. His doctorate is from the University of Oxford.

**MELISSEN Jan** is Editor-in-Chief of *The Hague Journal of Diplomacy*, Senior Fellow at Leiden University's Institute of Security and Global Affairs, The Hague, the Netherlands, and Professor of Diplomacy in the Department of Political Sciences at the University of Antwerp, Belgium. Jan has published over ten books and he is Editor of the Brill *Diplomatic Studies* Series. He recently contributed several articles to both *International Affairs* and *Global Policy*, and he also recently published in *Asia & the Pacific Policy Studies*, *International Studies Review*, *Global Affairs*, *European Foreign Affairs Review*.
